Registered experts from the company also provided technical assistance to different firms to develop their risk portfolio by assessing various risks facing the firm and to update and improve the firm's internal controls and systems to efficiently detect and prevent potential financial crimes.

FLE (previously known as 'FLE Legal Education') was established in 2005 as the foremost provider of the Qualified Lawyers Transfer Test (QLTT) in the Indian Sub-Continent, and was set up with the support of the Law Society of England and Wales and the British High Commissioner, New Delhi. The programme was launched in India to allow Indian lawyers to take this test while in their home country.
